<u>Stars</u>: Students who entered CSUN in 1995-2005 as Freshmen or Transfers, completed Bachelor's degrees at CSUN *or* elsewhere, *and* completed a Graduate degree elsewhere.


<u>Other People's Children</u>: Students who entered CSUN in 1995-2005 as Freshmen or Transfers, left CSUN before completing a degree, and earned Bachelor's degrees elsewhere.




